Program History

Educational Talent Search (ETS) is a TRiO program federally funded by the U.S. Department of Education. The first TRiO programs were created in 1964 under the Economic Opportunity Act. Today there are eight TRIO programs, which assist economically and educationally disadvantaged students in preparing, enrolling, and successfully completing postsecondary education.

ETS at PCC-DVC began providing services in the late '80s. Today the program is funded to serve 880 students enrolled at Desert View, Pueblo, and Sunnyside high schools.

Program Eligibility

- 2/3 of participating students served are low-income and first-generation
- > Students served need to be enrolled at participating high schools
- Students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Students must be US citizens or permanent residents
